

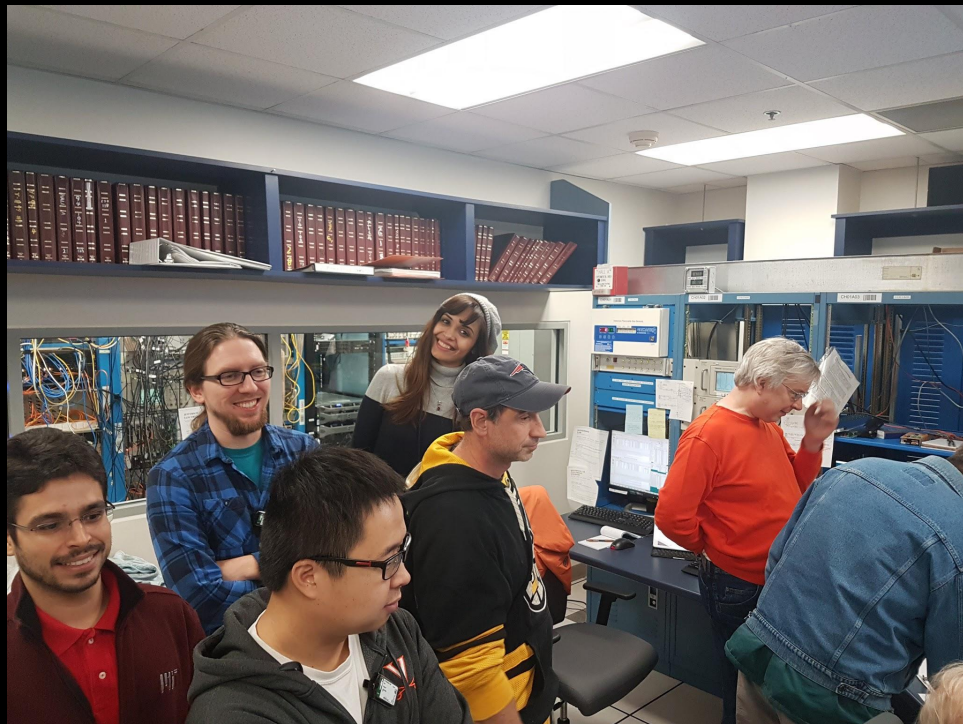
Hall A/C 2017/18 Awards

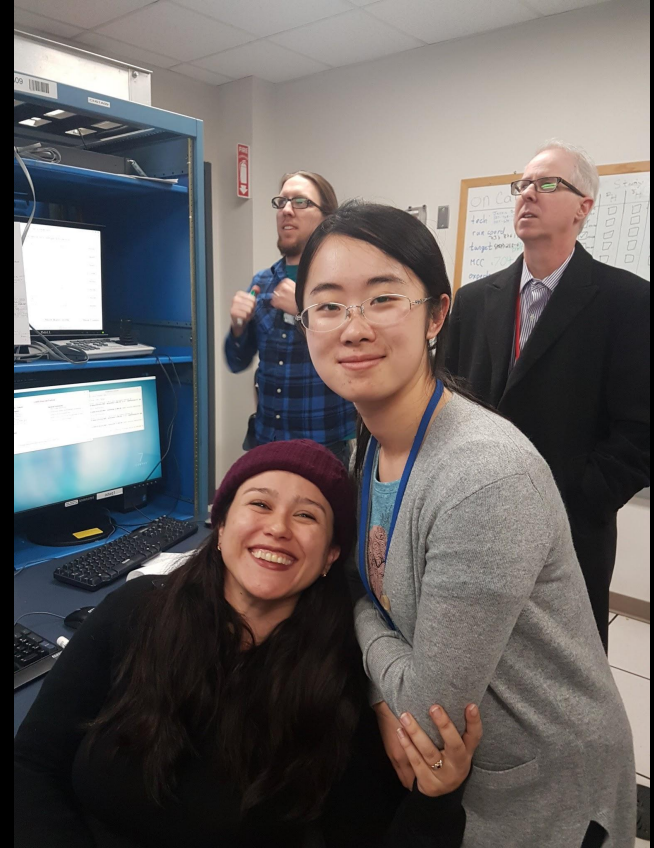

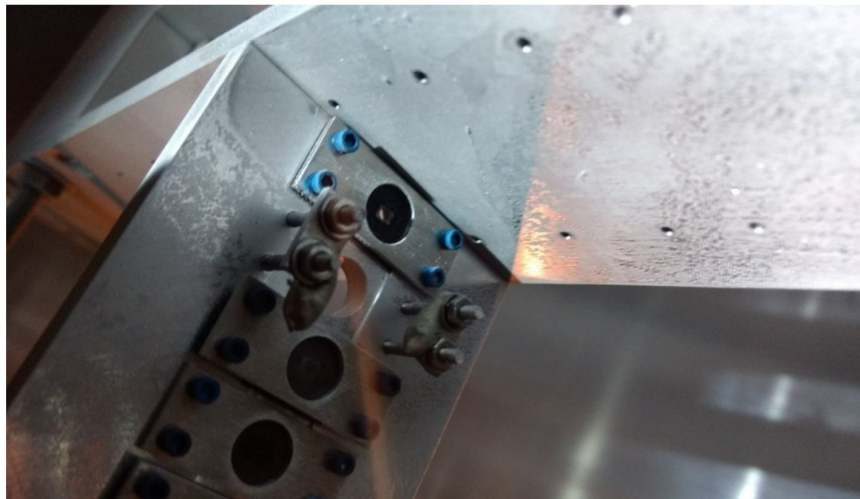
Carbon Target status

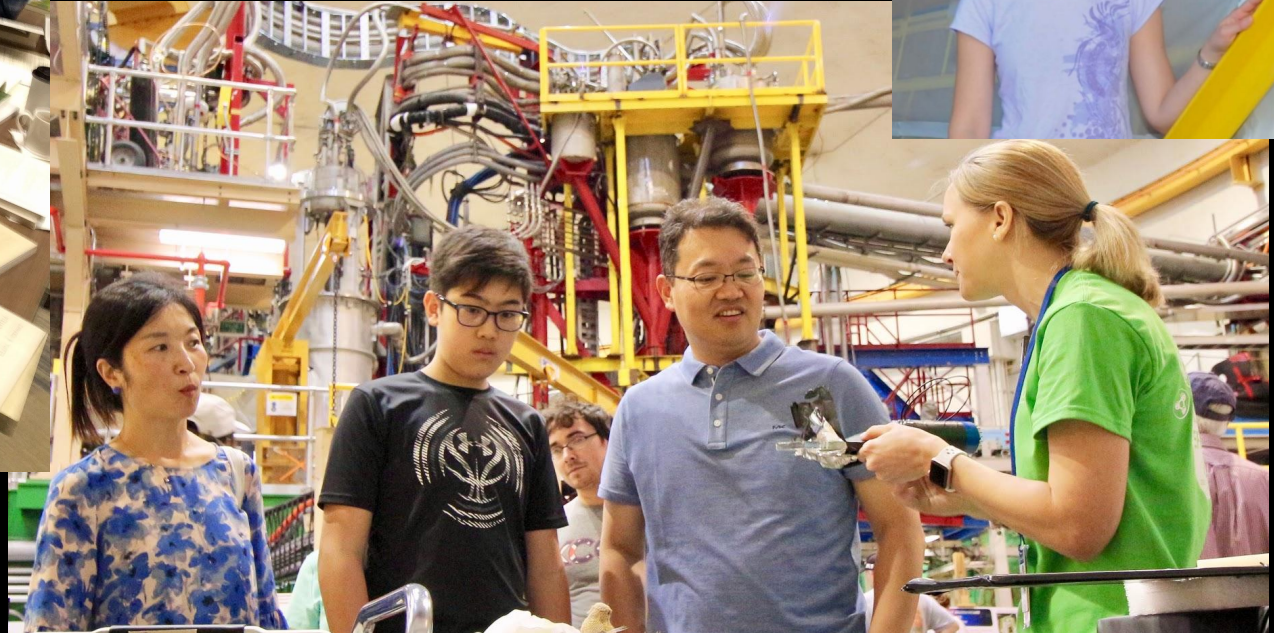

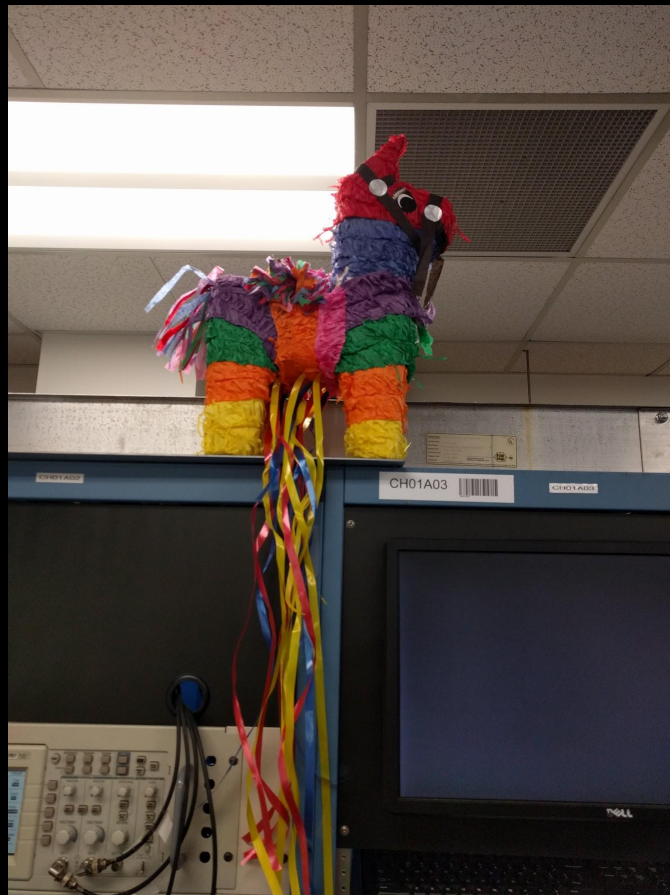

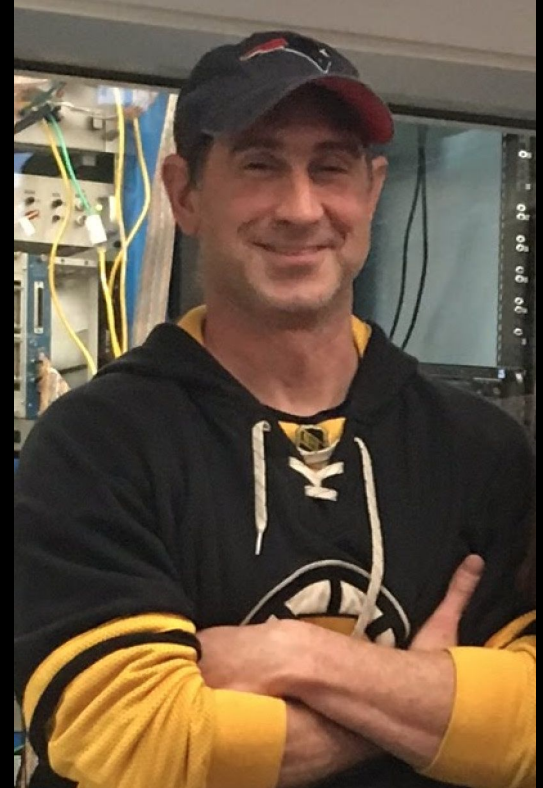
