




 Encourage and assist scientists and engineers in the use of the Continuous Electron Beam Accelerator Facility




Flagship Outreach event: Nuclear Physics Day on the Hill

Jefferson Lab

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- We should expect changes in policies and enforcement starting April 1.
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- Special care should be taken to comply with registration requirements before arriving on-site.

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International visitors

- Required to register in JLIST no later than 7 days prior to arrival.
- Not a new policy, but will be strictly enforced
- Without this, must be escorted by a JSA-employee host until access approval is granted.
- Upon arrival at Jefferson Lab, check in for verification of documents and to receive their access badge.
- Special requirements for State Department designated nations (only Iran, Sudan, Syria)

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BoD raised concerns about definitions and impact on users, and offered to help make sure the changes are clearly documented and communicated

JLUO BoD:
