The primary goal of POETIC XI is to continue the advancement of Electron-Ion Collider (EIC) related physics. The EIC, which has been granted Critical Decision 3A (CD-3A) by the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE), is to be constructed at Brookhaven National Lab in New York in partnership with Jefferson Lab (Jlab). This collider will be a groundbreaking research machine, pushing the boundaries of our understanding in accelerator science, particle detector design, high-performance computing, and beyond. The EPIC collaboration has formed around the first detector, and there is the possibility of having a second EIC detector.

The conference will bring together experts from around the world to discuss the latest developments, share innovative research, and foster collaborations in this exciting and evolving field. We look forward to your participation and contributions to the success of POETIC XI.
